Dear Chief Secretary,

This has reference to my earlier D.O. letter of even number dated 25th March, 2021, wherein States/UTs were asked to constitute Special Task Force under the chairpersonship of Chief Secretary / Administrator on the elimination of single use plastics and implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 and preparation of Comprehensive Action Plan in mission mode. As you are aware, these steps were an outcome of the review taken by Hon'ble Prime Minister in the PRAGATI meeting held on February 24, 2021.

For effective coordination and collaboration with all States/UTs and concerned central ministries/departments a National Task Force (NTF) has been constituted by the Ministry. The first meeting of NTF was held in virtual mode on 31.08.2021. The minutes of the meeting have already been shared and are also enclosed for ease of reference.

ACS(FED) It is requested that in where, STF has not been constituted, the same may be done expeditiously. Further, regular meetings of STF may be held to track the progress. It is also requested that the Comprehensive Action Plan may also be finalized and shared with the Ministry. The STF should also monitor implementation of State Action Plan for implementation in a time bound manner. The Ministry has shared indicative templates for constitution of STF and preparation of comprehensive action plan to facilitate States/UTs.

The Ministry is also developing a dashboard to effectively track progress on the elimination of single use plastic and plastic waste management. A nodal officer may be appointed for periodically updating actions taken by the States/UTs on the dashboard.

In line with the clarion call given by Hon'ble Prime Minister to phase out single use plastic by 2022, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, has notified the Plastic Waste Management Amendment Rules, 2021, prohibiting identified single use plastic items, which have low utility and high littering potential, by 2022. The notification was published in the Gazette of India on 12th August 2021.

I would request your personal intervention and support on the above issues, keeping in view the commitment of the Government to phase out identified single-use plastic items by 2022.

Minutes of First meeting of National Task Force for taking measures to eliminate identified single-use plastic items and effective implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016

The first meeting of the National Task Force, chaired by Secretary, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC), was held virtually on 31.08.2021 at 3 PM. The list of participants in the meeting is given at Annexure 1.

2. Shri Naresh Pal Gangwar, Joint Secretary (HSMD), MoEFCC, welcomed the representatives from States/UTs and concerned Central Ministries/Departments to the first meeting of the National Task Force for taking measures to eliminate identified single-use plastic items and effective implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016

The consolidated presentation had been prepared based on the inputs received from States/UTs and concerned Central Ministries. The consolidated presentation is at Annexure 2.

3. In his opening remarks, Secretary (EFCC) highlighted that littered plastic waste is emerging as a serious threat to the environment. Hon'ble Prime Minister made a clarion call to phase out single-use plastic items by 2022. It was informed that Hon'ble Prime Minister reviewed the elimination of single Use Plastic in the PRAGATI meeting held on 24th February, 2021. Subsequently, the following directions were received from PMO:

- All States should form a special taskforce to work in this issue in mission mode
- Targeted and wider awareness campaign may be launched
- Different groups should be targeted to achieve objectives,
 - Essay Competition among students
 - Organizations like NCC, NSS, Nehru Yuva Kendra etc
 - Hackathon among students and start-ups to promote innovations in the areas of alternate materials, recycling, circular economy etc.

It was informed that the Ministry has notified the Plastic Waste Management Amendment (PWM) Rules, 2021, in the Gazette of India prohibiting identified single use plastic items, which have low utility and high littering potential, by 2022, vide GSR NO. 571 (E) on 12th August 2021. Further the Ministry is working out the Guidelines for Extended Producer Responsibility under PWM Rules, 2016.

The National Task Force has been constituted by the Ministry for effective coordination and collaboration among all States/UTs and concerned central ministries/departments for taking measures to eliminate identified single-use plastic items in mission mode and effective implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules.

The progress made with respect to taking measures to eliminate identified single-use plastic items and effective implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules were reviewed as per the agenda (Annexure 3).

4. Agenda Item 1: Progress made by States/UTs

The following items were reviewed

I. Constitution of Special Task Force (STF) under chairpersonship of Chief Secretary and meeting of STF

As per the information available, 23 States and UTs have constituted the Special Task Force. The status is given below:

The representatives of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Uttar Pradesh, and Nagaland informed that STF has been constituted and that they shall share the orders with the Ministry. The states of Uttarakhand, Chattisgarh, Bihar, Manipur, Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra informed that the process of constitution of STF is in its advanced stages. Further, representatives of State Governments shared the steps taken by the State/UT Governments for elimination of identified single use plastic items.

Secretary (EFCC) requested the States which had not constituted STF as yet, to constitute the STF expeditiously and communicate the same to the Ministry in order to update the status. He mentioned that constitution of STF was the first step towards taking actions for elimination of single use plastic. It was also informed that indicative ToR and composition of the STF had been shared by the Ministry to all States/UTs for facilitation of State / UT Governments. Secretary, EFCC, stated that after formation of STF, regular meetings of STF needed to take place.

II. Comprehensive Action Plan

As per available information, Gujarat and Delhi have prepared the Comprehensive Action Plan, as per proforma, shared by the Ministry with State/UT Governments. The indicative action plan covers 10 thematic areas including 48 action points. The States/UTs may add thematic areas and activities as required. The status is given below:

Secretary (EFCC) requested all States/UTs to prepare the Comprehensive Action Plan as per the proforma shared by the Ministry with the States/UTs. After development of the Action Plan, implementation of the plan has to be done in a time bound manner.

III. Essay writing competition for school students:

It was informed that all States/UTs were requested to organize the essay writing competition. In this regard, guidelines for the competition were also shared with all States/UTs. A project coordination team and regional helpdesks have been set up for follow up and for facilitation in organization of the competition at District Level. A website (<https://indiaplasticchallenge.com>) has also been developed for the competition. Secretary EFCC, emphasized that awareness amongst school students was one of the most important tools to bring about behavioural change. Therefore, States/UTs should organize the essay writing competition for school students.

The status with respect to organization of Essay writing competition is given below:

Secretary (MoEFCC) requested the States/UTs take steps for the organization of the competition. Those States/UTs where districts had not initiated action might take up the matter on priority. It was further informed that District Education Officers /Nodal Officers should follow up on the competition diligently and ensure that it was organized in an effective manner.

IV. Action taken for reducing /elimination of single use plastic items in Government offices, attached /subordinate offices, PSUs/ organization and awareness generation

Secretary EFCC underscored the importance of Government to lead by example, in reducing /elimination of single use plastic items in Government offices, attached /subordinate offices, PSUs/ organization. It was pointed out that this shall send out an important message amongst citizens. Therefore, all State / UT Governments should take steps in this direction.

I Preparation of Action Plan

It was informed that the indicative action plan template along with thematic areas and activities were shared with the following ministries/departments/agencies:

- Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation
- Department of Chemicals & Petrochemicals
- Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises
- Department of Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade

- Department of Science & Technology
- Ministry of Earth Sciences
- Department of Higher Education
- Department of School Education & Literacy
- Department of Youth Affairs

It was informed that Department of Chemicals and Petrochemicals had prepared the Action Plan. It was also informed that in order to provide support to the plastic recycling enterprises provision had been made under the Plastic Parks Scheme of DCPC, as per scheme guidelines. It was also informed that CIPET would provide technical support to the recycling enterprises. Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation informed about the ongoing work on solid waste management which included plastic waste management under Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) 2.0, in a programme mode. The Department of Consumer Affairs informed about the standards developed by Bureau of Indian Standards with particular reference to plastic waste and alternatives to plastic.

Secretary (EFCC) requested all ministries/departments, whose comprehensive action plans were under preparation, to expedite the process.

II. Action taken for reducing /elimination of single use plastic items in Government offices, attached /subordinate offices, PSUs/ organization and awareness generation

Secretary EFCC reiterated the importance of Government to lead by example, in reducing /elimination of single use plastic items in Government offices, attached /subordinate offices, PSUs/ organization. Therefore, Central Ministries should take steps in this direction.

I. Policy and regulatory framework

It was informed that the Ministry has notified Plastic Waste Amendment Rules, 2021 prohibiting the use of identified single-use plastic items, which have low utility and high littering potential by 2022.

The following activities undertaken by the Ministry for awareness generation towards elimination of identified single-use plastics were presented:

Secretary (EFCC) further reiterated the need to take concrete action on reducing /elimination of single use plastic items in Government offices, attached /subordinate offices, PSUs/ organization and awareness generation

7. Agenda Item 4: Actions taken by CPCB

The following items were reviewed

I.	State-wise quarterly assessment with reference to Single Use Plastic items and prohibited SUP on sample survey basis by selected institutions
II.	Development of online portal for receiving complaints/grievances on PWM Rules at Central and State Level

I. State-wise quarterly assessment with reference to Single Use Plastic items and prohibited SUP on sample survey basis by selected institutions

CPCB informed that SPCBs/ PCCs were requested to undertake the survey vide letter dated 21.5.2021 and that Directions under Section 5 of EP Act were also issued on 29.7.2021. The formats of the assessments were shared with all SPCB/PCCs. As per the compiled information, 15 SPCB/PCCs have provided the information till date (Rajasthan, Karnataka, UP, Puducherry, Delhi, Chandigarh, Bihar, A&N Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Tripura, Telangana, Odisha)

It was also informed that CPCB had initiated study in 18 cities to be completed by 15.9.2021 (Vadodara & Surat, Pune & Sholapur, Bengaluru, Thrissur, Lucknow, Nainital, Indore & Bhopal, Kolkata & Barakpore, Panchkula, Chandigarh, Shillong, Gangtok, Chennai, Vijaywada).

Secretary EFCC stated that at least for an initial period the quarterly survey should be undertaken by expert institutions and that CPCB and SPCB shall be in the regulatory role. After discussion, it was agreed that CPCB would also take up Nilgiri as a site for the quarterly survey. It was agreed that alternatives to identified single use plastic items, which were being phased out, shall be displayed on website for ease of reference and use.

II. Development of online portal for receiving complaints/grievances on PWM Rules at Central and State Level

CPCB informed that a portal for Registration of Producers & Brand owners had been developed by CPCB. Information on SUP from States/UTs shall be integrated on the same portal.

III. Integration of online portal for receiving complaints/grievances with PWM portal developed by CPCB

CPCB informed that State UDDs had been asked to develop app-based mechanisms for addressing public complaints /grievances related to PWM Rules.

Secretary (EFCC) stated that an online portal be developed for receiving complaints/grievance with respect to implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, as amended, by CPCB.
